

## Story #913 Clinton Wallace

Tech Sergeant Clinton Wallace (1909-1988) was a Mazomanie World War II veteran and a charter member of the Mazomanie Greening – Buelow American Legion Post #437.

Clinton enlisted in the Army on April 27, 1942 in Milwaukee, with SN 16050597. He was in the Army Corps of Engineers. It is not known how long he served, what units he served in or where he was stationed.

Clinton Harland Wallace was born in Iowa County WI on February 11, 1909, the son of Mazomanie dairy farmer George Wallace and Leona Burdick. Clinton is first found with his relatives as a one year old living in Arena Township at the 1910 US Census. At the 1920 US Census the family has moved to Saratoga IA and then the family moved back to Clyde Township, Iowa County for the 1930 US Census. There he is a 30 year old farm laborer. In 1940 Clinton is a 30 year old, single truck driver living in Mazomanie with his family.

After service Clinton returned to Mazomanie, where at the 1950 US Census he is a 41 year old single truck driver. He became a heavy equipment operator for an international engineering company working throughout the world. Clinton never married and passed away in Sauk City on February 16, 1988. He is buried in the Mazomanie Cemetery.
